

**EAST HALTON PARISH COUNCIL
EAST HALTON CEMETERY**

Table of Fees, Payments and Sums

PART 1 – INTERMENTS – to include the Exclusive right of Burial where this has not already been purchased. The fees do not include the digging of the grave.

i. For the interment of the body of a still born child whose age at the time of death did not exceed one month.	No fee.
ii. For the interment of a person whose age at the time of death exceeded one month but not more than eighteen years.	No fee.
iii. For the interment of a person whose age at the time of death exceeded eighteen years.	£70.00
iv. For the interment of cremated remains.	£60.00
v. For re-opening a double grave.	£45.00

PART 2 – EXCLUSIVE RIGHT OF BURIAL IN EARTHEN GRAVES

i. For the exclusive Right of Burial in perpetuity.	£80.00
ii. For the exclusive Right of Burial of cremated remains in perpetuity.	£70.00

PART 3 – MEMORIALS – for the right to erect or place:-

i. A headstone not exceeding 3 feet (or metric equivalent) in width and 3 feet 6 inches (or metric equivalent) in height.	£70.00
ii. A tablet for cremated remains.	£40.00

The fees, payments and sums set out above, apply where the person to be interred or in respect of whom right is granted is, or has at any one time been an inhabitant or parishioner of the Parish of East Halton or, in the case of a still born child, where the parents (or one of them) are or have been an inhabitant or parishioner. In all other cases fees will be doubled.

CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Notice of interment is to be given to the Clerk of the Parish Council at least two days prior to any interment. No application will be received on Sundays.
2. All fees and charges due to the Council are to be paid to the Clerk on or before the interment.
3. No burial can take place before 9am or after sunset, without special permission.
4. The selection of the grave space is to be subject to the approval of the Council but the wishes of the applicant will be met as far as is practicable.
5. All memorials, vases, tablets, inscriptions and plantings are to have Parish Council approval.
6. Any person found wilfully damaging any part of the cemetery is liable to prosecution.
7. All visitors are requested to behave in a right and proper manner and where possible keep off the paths. If persons are found conducting themselves in a noisy, riotous or disorderly manner they will be expelled from the cemetery.
8. The Parish Council are not liable for damage done to any memorial. The upkeep and safety of memorials is not the responsibility of the Council.
9. No dogs are allowed to enter the cemetery.
10. The area north of the path and parallel to Crook Mill Road is designated as a Garden of Remembrance for burial of cremated remains.
